“Heredity”

This month *Science Trek* explores heredity. The passing down of traits from parent to child is called heredity, and the study of how those traits go from generation to generation is called genetics. We start by learning what DNA and genes are and how they make us who we are. Scientists Kevin Feris, a professor of microbial ecology at Boise State University, and KT Curry, a licensed certified genetic counselor specializing in general, pediatric and cardiovascular genetic counseling, provide information. One episode will follow KT Curry through her day as she helps families learn more about their genetic history and what that means for their futures.

The *Science Trek* website has facts, links, lesson plans, games, and other educational support material correlated to Idaho and national science standards.
